

Film Classification and Certification

What certificate should this film be?

Using the BBFC guidelines, decide what certificate you think this film should be and give your justification in the box below. Remember that you will need to relate your decision to the BBFC guidelines so you may want to list any examples of dialogue or any particular scenes that make the film unsuitable for some certificates.

PG	Unaccompanied children of any age may watch. A PG film should not disturb a child aged around eight or older however parents are advised to consider whether the content may upset younger or more sensitive children.
12A	No one younger than 12 may see the film in a cinema unless accompanied by an adult. No one younger than a 12 may rent or buy a 12A-rated video. General viewing but some scenes may be unsuitable for young children.
12	No one younger than 12 may see the film in the cinema. No one younger than a 12 may rent or buy a 12-rated video. Some scenes include bad language and some violence and are unsuitable for children.
15	No one younger than 15. The film may have a fairly adult theme. It may have some scenes of sex or violence or some bad language.
18	No one younger than 18. The film will have an adult theme. It may have some strong scenes of sex or violence or bad language.
