


BFI Relaxed Cinema Screenings Guide

BFI Southbank is situated next to the river underneath Waterloo Bridge. Waterloo station is the nearest tube station.




The main entrance is on Theatre Avenue.

TICKETS

If you don't not already have your paper ticket or e ticket you will need to collect it from the box office desk. You might have to wait in a queue but it won't take too long.



FOOD AND DRINK

If you want to you can get something to eat and drink at either the BFI Bar & Kitchen or the BFI Riverfront. The BFI Bar & Kitchen is near the main foyer. There is also a Grab and Go station there. The BFI Riverfront is at the back of the building by the River Thames.



Grab and Go Drink Area

TOILETS

You can find toilets across the building.

SCREENING ADJUSTMENTS

Our Relaxed Screenings and Events are often shown in NFT3 Cinema, which is located up the stairs to the left of the box office. The doors to NFT3 will open 20 minutes before the advertised screening time.

There are wheelchair spaces available in the auditorium. You can ask a member of staff at the box office for wheelchair access.




At the entrance to NFT3 the area is much darker and can be a little colder.



In the cinema you can sit wherever you like and you can come in and out of the cinema any time. You are welcome to bring drinks and snacks into the cinema but hot food is not allowed.

During the film, you are free to move around in the auditorium and make noise.

If you need a quiet area you can leave the cinema by the back doors where there will be an area to sit and relax.



There will be a short introduction before the film starts. If you have any questions you can talk to one of the BFI staff members who will be at the screening.
